UNIFORMS

- **No shadow numbers**
- **Body of numbers must contrast with the shirt color.**
- **Libero – contrasting, no more solid color, we have a document posted: snoavb.com**



STUFF

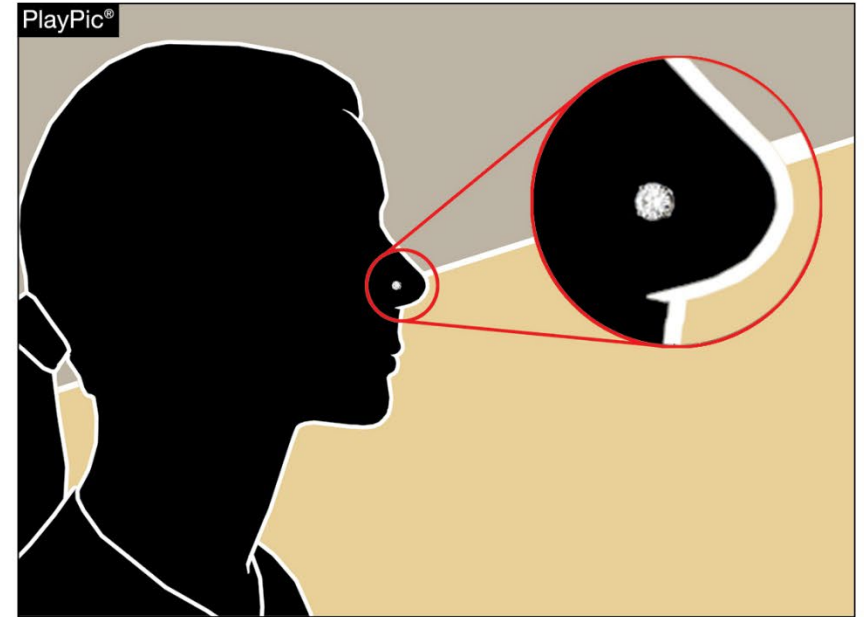
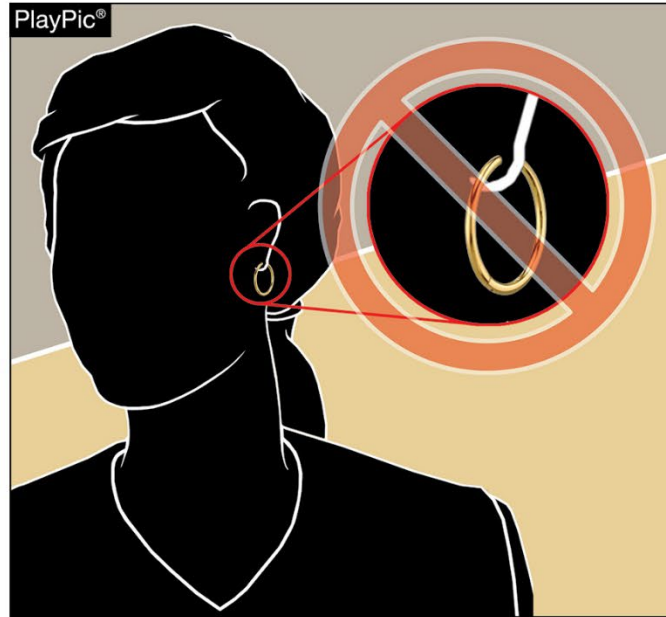
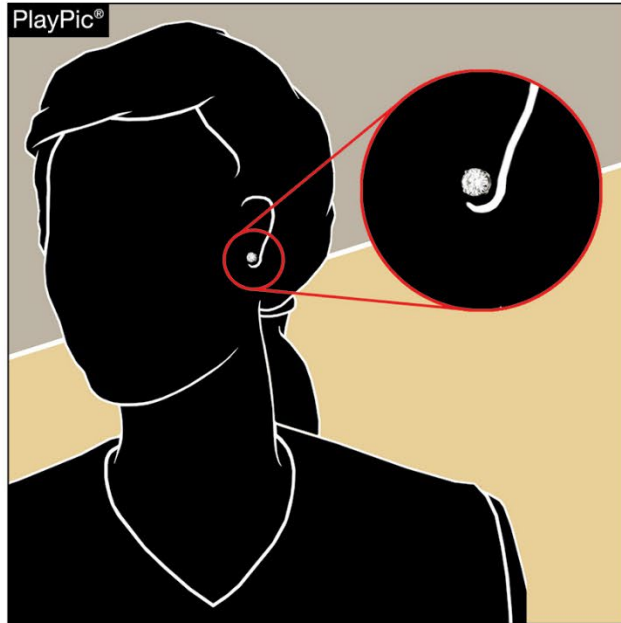

EQUIPMENT AND ACCESSORIES

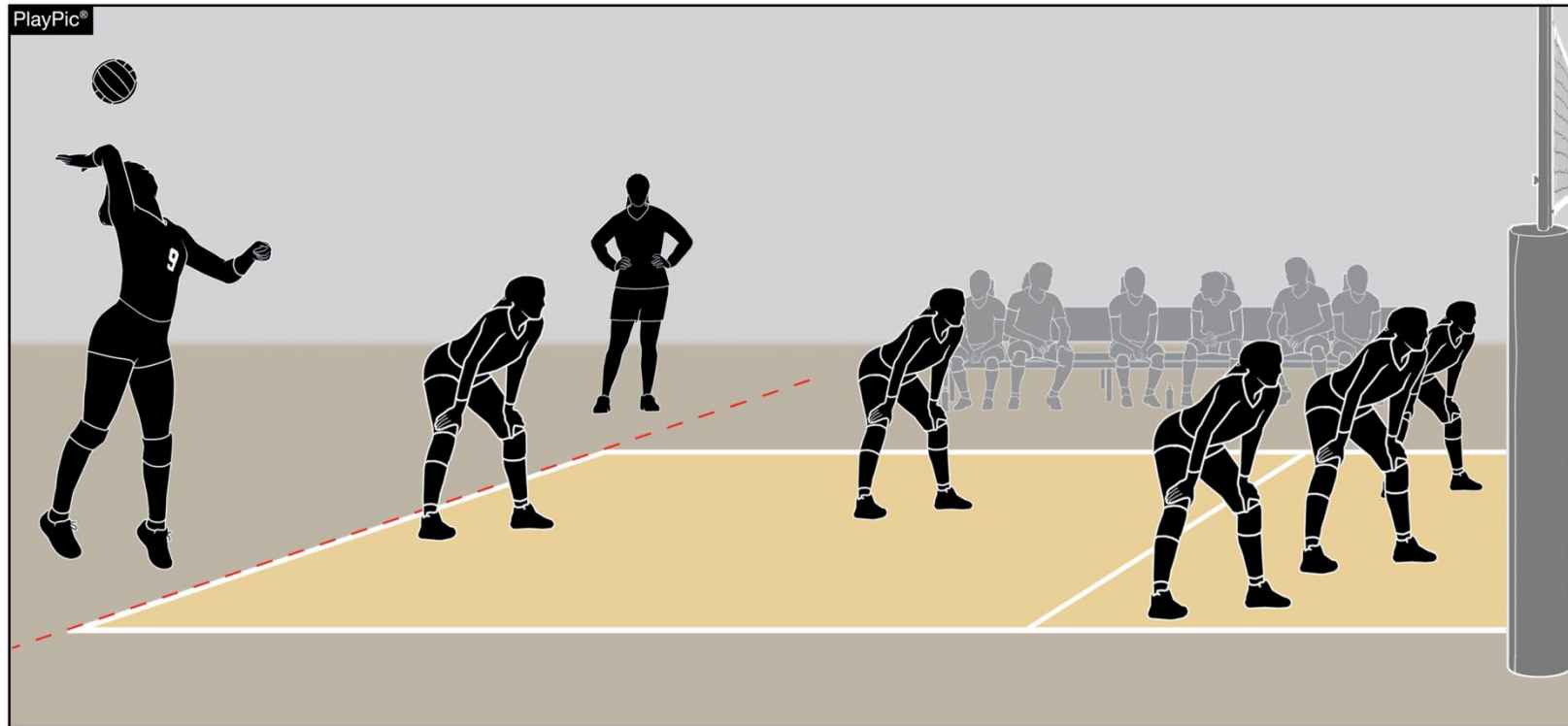

- Small, secured stud or post jewelry may be worn above the chin.
- No jewelry is permitted below the chin.



COACHING ZONE PRIVILEGES



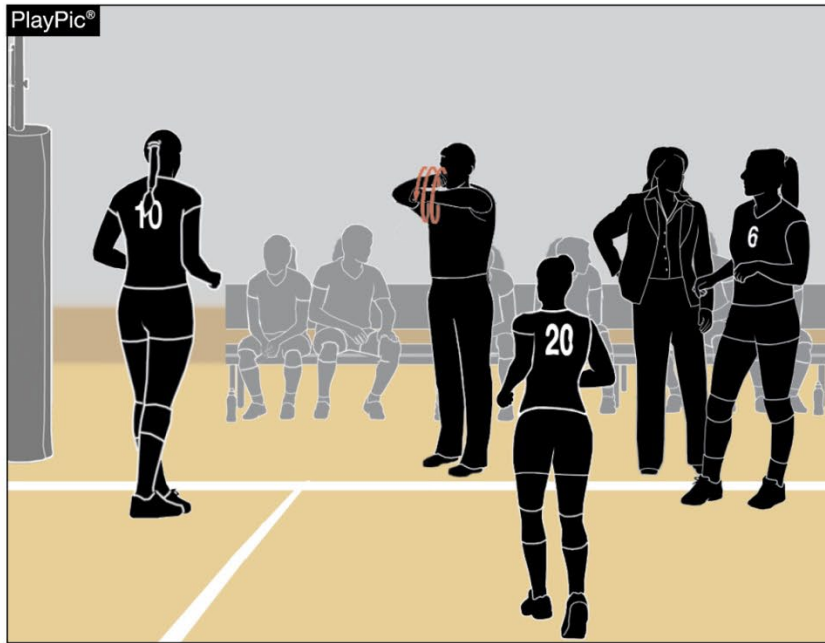
- The head coach may stand and coach beyond the libero replacement zone. However, the coach must remain six feet off the court during play and may not cross the sideline extended during dead-ball situations.



CONDUCT

5-5-3b(11), 12-2-6

Live Ball



- One assistant coach may stand within the coaching zone to provide instruction during dead-ball situations only.
- The assistant coach who stands may change throughout the match – **only one** can stand at a time.

BEHAVIOR





- **Unsporting conduct** “consists of acts of deceit, disrespect, or vulgarity, and includes taunting.”
- “No player, teammate, coach and/or team attendant shall act in an unsporting manner while on or near the court before, during or between sets.”

BASICS

BAD THINGS

- a. Using disconcerting acts or words when an opponent is about to play the ball;
- b. Disrespectfully addressing a referee and/or other match officials;
- c. Questioning or trying to influence referees' decisions;
- d. Showing disgust with referees' decisions;





- **Using profane or insulting language or gestures or baiting/taunting anyone involved in the contest;**
- **The NFHS disapproves of any form of taunting which is intended or designed to embarrass, ridicule or demean others under any circumstances.**
